Amanda's Plan for Small Businesses:

- › **Tax Reform:** Make permanent provisions of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act including the 20 percent tax deduction on small business income for pass through entities.
- › **Regulation:** Adkins is committed to:
 - › Strong protections to ensure federal agencies conduct a full cost analysis of all new regulation
 - › Giving small businesses the ability to correct minor OSHA violations before expensive fines are levied
 - › Continued review and rollback by the Administration of unnecessary federal regulations
- › **Workforce:** Adkins will work to:
 - › Provide benchmarks and accountability for higher education and workforce readiness
 - › Increase caps on employment-based visa programs to provide employers with the ability to meet their workforce needs in a timely manner
 - › Encourage workforce development and readiness initiatives
- › **Healthcare:** Congress needs to provide tools for small business owners to address healthcare in a way that works best for their employees and their families. This includes:
 - › **Association Health Plans** that allow small businesses access to lower-cost health plans
 - › **Expanding Healthcare Savings Accounts** to allow employees to put away more pre-tax dollars for out-of-pocket costs and deductibles
 - › **Promoting Medical Price Transparency** requiring hospitals and pharmaceuticals to disclose information about their pricing

Contributions to the Amanda Adkins for Congress Committee are not tax deductible for federal income tax purposes. Contributions are subject to the limits and prohibitions of the Federal Election Campaign Act. Federal law requires us to use our best efforts to collect and report the name, mailing address, occupation and name of employer of individuals whose contributions exceed \$200 in an election cycle. Contributions from corporations, labor organizations, foreign nationals, federal government contractors, and contributions made using another person or entity's funds are prohibited. All contributions are subject to the following limits: from an individual or non-multicandidate PAC, \$2,800 per election; from a multicandidate PAC, \$5,000 per election; from a married couple, with each spouse's signature, \$5,600 per election. For purposes of these per election limits, the primary and general elections are deemed to be separate elections.
